

Voting in the Nov. 3 Election



Ways to vote:

- Absentee by mail
- In-person absentee (early voting)
 - Hours and location vary by municipality
- Election Day
 - Polls are open from 7am-8pm

What's on the ballot:

- U.S. President and Vice President
- U.S. Congress
- State Senate
- State Assembly
- Local partisan races





Voter Eligibility

You are eligible to vote if:

- You are a U.S. Citizen
- You will be at least 18 years old on or before Election Day
- You have resided in WI for 28 days prior to the election
- You are not currently serving a sentence including incarceration, parole, probation, or extended supervision for a felony conviction
- You have not been determined by a court to be ineligible to vote (for example: through a guardianship decision)





Voter Registration

Who needs to register?

- First time voters
- If you've moved
- If you've changed your name
- If you haven't voted in over 4 years

How to register:

- Online (up to 20 days before the election)*
- **By mail to your municipal clerk** (up to 20 days before the election)
- In person at your municipal clerk's office (through the Friday before the election)
- At your polling place on Election Day





Proof of Residence

- Must include your name and current address
- Can be paper or electronic






